



## National Supreme Court cases on freedom of movement and on ICT and media

**[London/Luxembourg, 8 July 2008]:** Caselex has started to roll out cases on freedom of movement law and on ICT and medial law. In parallel it launches Latvian Supreme Court cases, bringing its total case coverage to nine areas of law and 23 countries.

### Freedom of movement – a fundamental right inside the EU

Freedom of movement is the basic pillar of the single area the EU has been building since its inception. The EU's treaty provisions, secondary legislation and court decisions, recognize four fundamental freedoms protecting the ability of goods, services, capital, and persons to move freely within the internal market of the EU. It does also hold provisions for free movement of workers and freedom of establishment.

### Cases focusing on transmission and content

The European Information Society has developed rapidly. New technologies and solutions combined with market forces pushing not only for the Single Market, but a global Information Society, has called for European initiatives such as the Television without Frontiers Directive, EU roaming regulation, harmonised standards, and the liberalisation of the telecommunications sector. Today, there are two main areas of Information Society regulation at European level: Transmission & Content. Caselex does now offer national Supreme Court cases interpreting this regulatory framework.

### From data protection to radio spectrum

Europe's regulations within transmission and content on global networks span a wide range of issues such as eCommerce, domain names, data protection, television and broadcasting, electronic communications, advertising, exploitation of public sector information and cyber crime.
